OVERVIEW:

Jobs + Opportunity for Jasper County Region

The 4,260 acre Riverport master-planned development near Hardeeville, SC, will serve commercial, industrial, and residential needs. It is a greenfield project, so everything is new — hotels, restaurants, shopping centers, medical facilities, offices, and apartments. And the proposed new construction of Exit 3 and widening of I-95 will take significant pressure off of Exit 5 and provide an alternative hurricane evacuation route.

The project will generate thousands of direct and indirect jobs; generate millions in tax revenues for the county, city, and school district; and deliver significant economic benefits and an improved quality of life to one of the state's most underserved counties.

More Jobs, More Tax Revenues, More Opportunities



Construction is expected to have a direct economic impact of \$176,400,000 and create 1,051 new jobs.



Upon completion of construction, the project is estimated to generate annual property taxes of \$38,000,000, along with \$48,100,000 for the school district, and \$28,200,000 for the City of Hardeeville.



There is an expected indirect impact of \$30,700,000 with the creation of 238 jobs.



After 31 years of buildout, the economic impact will reach

billions of dollars and create 20,621 jobs.

Within five years of construction, annual property tax for the county is estimated to \$5,100,000, and \$6,400,000 generated for the school district while \$3,700,000

is generated for the city.

Jasper County and its residents need this project.
 The county's poverty rate is 20 percent, compared with 14.4 percent nationally, and the median household income is \$45,000 compared with \$70,074.



The project area encompasses 4,260 acres. The proposal will impact just 46.34 acres of wetlands (1 percent of the total). The project proponents have proposed permanently preserving over 2,800 acres of wetlands and upland buffers on the project site.
